LANGUAGE

- Recognizes the letters of the alphabet in and out of sequence
- Has phonemic awareness
- Recognizes most sight words
- Begins to identify phonograms when reading and writing
- Writes name in print and cursive with proper letter formation
- Authorship creates stories, writes letters
- Introduction to basic grammar and sentence analysis: verb, noun, adjective, adverb

- Opportunities to work together with Kindergarteners from other classrooms

MUSIC

- Explores various instruments including the Montessori bells
- Distinguishes between beat and rhythm
- Studies melodic contour: sounds move high-low or
- Works with all operations using the decimal system -Golden Beads and Stamp Game (static and dynamic)
- Introduction to fractions including equivalence, addition and subtraction
- Tells time to the nearest hour and half hour
- Begins learning about money (counting, adding, subtracting)
- Recognizes, builds, and works with numbers above 100
- Names geometric shapes (2D and 3D)

CULTURAL

- Knows and labels the continents, countries in North America, and the states on the USA map introduction to maps of each continent
- Labels and identifies land and water forms
- Learns about flags throughout the world
- Fosters curiosity in cultures of the world
- Introduction to zoology and botany
